The Montessori classroom offers him the opportunity to choose from a wide variety of graded materials. The child can grow as his interests lead from one level of complexity to another. Having children ages three through six together permits the younger children a graded series of models for imitation, and the older ones an opportunity to reinforce their own knowledge by helping the younger ones.

National TV-Turn off Week

Before entering Kindergarten the average youth has spent 5000-8000 hours staring at a television set. For three-to-five year old children, this huge amount of inactivity occurs during the height of their brain's critical period for cognitive and language development, potentially hindering vital learning abilities such as paying attention and communicating. During the week of April 23-29, millions of Americans will voluntarily turn off their TV sets for seven days and rediscover that life can be more constructive, rewarding, and healthy-even relaxing with more time and less TV.

Interesting facts about TV

- Number of 30-second commercials seen in a year by an average child: 20,000
- Number of minutes per week that parents spend in meaningful conversation with their children: 38.5
- Percentage of day care centers that use TV during a typical day: 70
- Hours per year the average American youth spends in school: 900 hours
- Hours per year the average American youth watches television: 1500
- Percentage of Americans that regularly watch television while eating dinner: 66
