TUITION

Tuition Express

Most of our parents are now signed up for Tuition Express. It will make your life just a little less hectic when you don't have to worry about making that tuition check out every month. With Tuition Express your tuition will comes directly from your account.

You can even take out for your pizza ticket. Now how easy is that!

For anyone running late at pickup time, if you would please call to reassure us (and we can reassure your child) that you are okay and on your way.

Every Friday is pizza day! The cost for a monthly pizza ticket is \$15.00 for toddler/ preschool and \$20.00 for Elementary.

REMINDERS

Please do not send anything with high sugar content. As a basic rule of thumb, send only items that do not have sugar in the first three ingredients. Please check the Capri Suns, some of them have sugar and some say 100% juice.

We can only accept 100% Juice, water or plain milk.

Reminders:

If your preschool age child does not already have a gallon size Ziploc bag please send one with a change of clothing in it. Please label everything brought into the classroom, including lunchboxes, jackets extra changes of clothes, backpacks, etc.

Your child's paper work, projects, and blankets will go home every Friday. Do not be discouraged if your child doesn't bring home any work. Most Montessori work is hands on lessons that remain on the classroom shelves.

Due to limited space in the classrooms, you may send a backpack with your child on Fridays only to take work home

Pickup & Drop Off

All extended (8:30-3:30) Preschool students should be dropped off at the front door between 8:20-8:30. At drop off and pick up time parents are reminded to remain in the office area until their children are brought to the front door. Leave all cell phones on silent when entering the building. This is to provide

an orderly procedure and to ensure safety for all of our students.

Extended day Elementary students should be dropped off at the back door between 8:10 and 8:20. Pick up time is between 3:20-3:30. Before or after those times please come to the front door.

Childcare charges for late pickup are \$8 per hour for extended day (3:30pm) students and \$15 charge after 6:01pm plus additional charges for every 15 minutes after.

Medication

All medication brought to school must be in its original container and labeled with your child's name and current date. Medication must be signed in at the front desk before we can administer it to your child. We are not permitted by the Texas Department of Health

to give your child Tylenol without a doctors' written consent. We are also not allowed to dispense over the counter medication that is not age appropriate for your child unless we have doctor's permission.

As the mosquitoes have been very plentiful this

summer we are very low on insect repellent. Everyone must send in a new bottle of bug repellent for your child. All bottles must be labeled with your child's name and signed in the office.

Tumblebus

Tumblebus will be out after August 9. They will resume their regular schedule in September. If you would like to sign up for Tumblebus, just fill out a registration form and put it in the box in the office along with your payment. The registration fee is \$15

(includes a t-shirt) and monthly tuition is \$35. If your child is already signed up for Tumblebus you do not have to re-register but you may purchase a new Tumblebus shirt for \$15. New students, ages two through five, will receive one free class.
