School Closed/Care Open

December 20th through December 23rd School will be closed/care will be open. December 24th school will be closed/care open until 12:00 p.m. after which the normal charge of \$10.00 for every 15 minutes will apply. School will remain closed from Monday, December 27th through Friday, December 31st 2010. We will be back in school Monday, January 3rd, 2011.

Register for Care

Monday, Dec. 20th thru Friday, Dec. 24th until 12:00 p.m. school is closed/care is open. Each parent will need to <u>register</u> with the front office no later than Wednesday, Dec. 15th. There is no additional charge for full day students, daily tuition rate will be charged to <u>extended</u> day students. All payments must be made on or before care, and all students <u>must be registered</u> for care regardless of what program they are in.

Brisket Drawing

A smoked brisket is the drawing prize for families using Tuition Express. All families enrolling during December are eligible (along with currently enrolled Tuition Express families) for a fully cooked, smoked brisket from Sweeny, Texas. Attached is the enrollment form; return it along with a voided check to the office to be eligible.

Tuition Payment

To avoid the \$20 late payment fee, you will need to leave a check with the office before you leave for the holidays. We are closed and cannot receive payments from noon on December 24 through Monday, January 3, 2011. All checks will be held until January 1. Families using Tuition Express will be processed as usual.
