Please send a basket labeled with your child's name for our egg hunt which will be Thursday, April 5th.


Welcome to our classroom Diya Mattamana who moved up from room 102!

## **Registration Forms**


The Summer/ Fall registration forms will be available soon. Please fill out the registration form and return by May 1st in order to assure your child's space in our program.

## National TV—Turn off Week April 23—29



Before entering Kindergarten the average youth has spent 5000—8000 hours staring at a television. For three to five year old children, this huge amount of inactivity occurs during the height of their brain's critical period for cognitive and language development, potentially hindering vital learning abilities such a paying attention and communicating. During the week of April 23—29, millions of Americans will voluntarily turn off their TV sets for seven days and rediscover that life can be more constructive, rewarding, and healthy, even relaxing with more time and less TV.

#### Interesting facts about TV

- Number of 30-second commercials seen in a year by an average child: 20,000
- Number of minutes per week that parents spend in meaningful conversation with their children: 38.5
- Percentage of day care centers that use TV during a typical day: 70
- Hours per year the average American youth spends in school: 900 hours
- Hours per year the average American youth watches television: 1500
- Percentage of Americans that regularly watch television while eating dinner: 66
