In science we will welcome spring and plant our spring garden learning about parts of a seed, plant and flower.

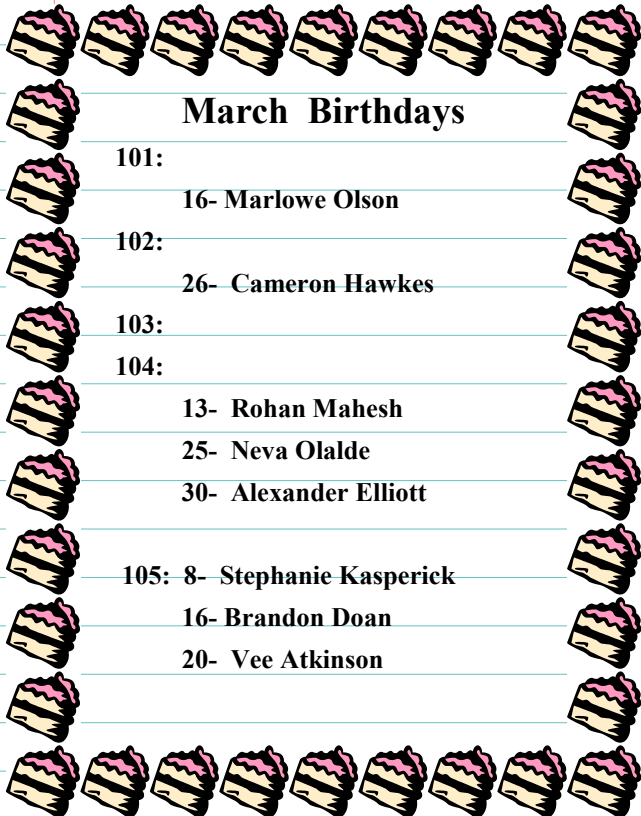
Room 105:

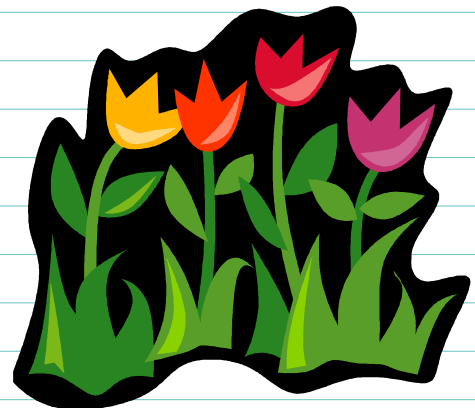


Spring Break
